#### Pastor's Letter



We wish our friend and colleague, Jim Lennon, all the best as he retires as Financial Secretary after volunteering on the Finance Committee for 21 years. For those of you who might not have a calculator handy: 52 weeks per year x 21 years = 1092 Sundays (+ or -)

Jim, thank you for your dedicated service to God and the Church on the Cape. When I consider the time and commitment involved, I can imagine there must have been a strong support network and sacrifice of family time over the years. For this reason, I need to sincerely thank Joan Lennon and hereby grant her a lifetime achievement award for "Best Supporting Spouse of a Church Financial Secretary".

With Jim retiring, Adrien Baracco will be taking over as the new Financial Secretary. David Smith will be filling the position of Assistant Financial Secretary, and Ruth Lovejoy will be the Assistant Treasurer. I would like to thank them all for volunteering.

As for the numbers, the finances for the Church on the Cape (COTC), have been rather dynamic. In spite of the numerous challenges, we experienced in 2020, we are not far from where we should be for the year. Through the month of November, we had quite a few expenses that typically are due in the fall, combined with an increase in the electronic communications budget.

As of November 30, 2020

Revenue to Budget: \$253,036 Expenditures from Budget: \$262,058 Net (\$9,022)

It is important to note that an additional \$8,070 was received in donations for designated income. Designated income is not considered part of the budget.

#### **Stewardship Update**

The Finance Committee is still waiting for more pledge card responses to be returned before we can finalize and approve a budget for 2021. As of December 28<sup>th</sup>, there were only 88 out of 182 responses received.
